Greetings!

Boise Project Board of Control's website (<https://boiseproject.net/public>) at time of this memorandum has a public announcement that reads in part:

Due to the increased precipitation that has recently occurred, the Army Corps of Engineers and the Bureau of Reclamation will begin Flood Release Management on April 15th, 2026 out of Arrowrock and Lucky Peak Reservoirs while continuing to hold releases out of Anderson Ranch Reservoir to a minimum to accrue as much storage as possible in Anderson.

**Due to this change in conditions, the Boise Project will not be starting out on allotment as previously announced, but an allotment will be reevaluated and set after Flood Release Management operations have ceased.**

This press release is to further serve as notice to parents and children alike of the approaching hazards of water in the irrigation canals.

Boise Project had previously announced that they believed they would be able to deliver roughly 27% of the system's design capacity for a good water year, and that the season would end early.

After Boise Project has re-evaluated their delivery, the city can re-evaluate the following drought plan:

**The City Municipal Irrigation System's 2026 Drought Delivery Plan:** The city currently intends to begin putting water into the gravity irrigation system serving the majority of the city on 28 April 2026 (start date may be delayed if rain occurs), for two-day 24-hour periods starting at approximately 8:00a on Tuesday mornings and ending at approximately 8:00a on Thursday mornings.

The city's hope and belief is that by conserving water this spring, the city will be able to increase the number of days of the week that water will be available later as temperatures increase this summer. This is not guaranteed. The city's hope and belief is that the 2026 season will extend into September. This also is not guaranteed.
